REMAKING aims to deliver a policy-oriented framework reflecting the new and multi-faceted realities of Remote Working, facilitating policymakers to adopt place-based policies balancing the opportunities and risks of Remote Working and sharing practices to foster mutual learning on RW in the novel scenario of megatrends and shocks.

REMAKING will investigate the multiple impacts of remote working from the perspective of second-tier cities and rural areas and their evolving equilibrium with metropolitan areas, highlighting challenges, problems, and opportunities that policymakers might decide to address.

CASE STUDIES

REMAKING objectives will be achieved through participatory research activities across 4 case studies, each addressing a different form of remote working. The 4 case studies are contextualized within ongoing megatrends and recent disruptive shocks.
